Can you tell us about any aspect of the school over the past 12 months which has pleased you and you would like to see us continue with?

The Break Out days have been thoroughly enjoyed by the children. It is great to see the school using the local environment to continue the children's' learning outside the classroom. The recent carol service showed a good emphasis on music and performance – good to see quieter children stepping up and speaking in public.

Year 1 separate class (Rabbits) has been a very good move for my child.

The head teacher profile in the playground is a very popular result & allows ease of communication.

Separate class for Rabbits - brilliant!

We are really excited at the changes which are taking place within the school. Particularly the emphasis on raising the pupils/staff's expectations within a learning environment which is serious as well as fun. Let's continue to make Barcombe school a centre of excellence preparing our children for life beyond school.

Trips and workshops that have supported topics that take learning outside the 'normal' class room situation.

Is there an aspect of the school that you would like to see improved?

Rosa has only been at school since September so it's hard to comment, but the previous school sent school cons (?) via email & texts and this is VERY helpful as separated parents + two homes.

The class size in Hedgehogs does seem large and potentially overwhelming. The school has done well managing this and adding the Rabbit class.

We still feel there could be more sport. Sport fuels energy levels and brains and teaches valuable lessons in teamwork.

The standard of music & singing at the carol service was great. We would love to see this continue and see music as a key part of every day learning.

Water! Our children don't seem to be able to fill up their water bottles easily from the fountain. Water & hydration are so good for keeping up concentration levels and fighting germs. Could all children be offered water at lunch irrespective of school lunch or packed lunch?

Outside play when wet! If children indoors all day they lose concentration and are sluggish.

More playing outside and teaching outside.

The music lessons could include learning an instrument.

Playground could be more user friendly.

More outdoor play/learning. School wellies?

Placing value on sport and team games – making sure every class is active in sport.

Integrating outdoor learning into each year's learning journey. Be creative and adventurous in learning techniques.

Bullying session as an annual session for parents or part of parent reception to feed it into parents and introduce how to deal with it. Plus how school deal with bullying and what departments get involved.

More support for PTA and access for them to communicate with parents i.e. one allocated text a month to inform parents of large fundraiser.

Less project based homework – I would prefer to see a single sheet of math's homework or times table to be the focus of homework. This means the child can do this independently with input as needed.

A playground water fountain to avoid buying/losing/forgetting water bottles & encourage more water drinking especially in lunch hour.

Think the prefects should be rotated so each child can 'step up to the mark, and have a chance of extra responsibility.

Greater emphasis on raising staff teaching standards – we are all winners as a result of this.

We would also like to see greater cohesion between staff, staff reps and parents and governors.
$Greater \ use \ of \ immediate \ environment \ e.g. \ `Wild \ about \ Barcombe', \ Knowlands \ Wood, \ more `Break \ Out' \ days \ that \ involve \ local \ community.$
Greater and stronger links with Barcombe Church and the church community et some older/retired parishioners may be available to hear readers etc., once all necessary checks are done – a notice could be given out at church services or put in Barcombe News?
