Break Out Of Barcombe

Yesterday the children in Year 2 enjoyed a Break Out Experience. The children walked to Knowlands wood where they cooked pancakes over an open fire, collected a range of natural materials to make puppets and worked with the Break Out team in drama and role play activities. The children also created prints in paint using the materials they had collected. The adults and children particularly enjoyed learning about all the different species of bugs and wildlife as they walked to the woods!

Reception Welly Walk

Yesterday the Reception children went on a Welly Walk across the Recreation ground and in to Wild About Barcombe. They collected and counted acorns and conkers, collected lots of sticks, leaves and natural materials and used these to make patterns and shapes, they measured the materials against each other and developed there use of language. Everyone had a fantastic time!

The children in Year 6 travelled to Glyndebourne Opera House yesterday afternoon to enjoy a performance of 'Die Entfrung aus dem serial Mozart'. The opera is set in the 18th Century; the same period as Thomas Gainsborough painted Mr and Mrs Gainsborough.
