Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of the year for Year 6, albeit rather sooner than we thought, we would like to first of all thank you and your children for your support both during lockdown and since we have been back at school. Water Fight.

If children wish to use water balloons (and are prepared to pick up all the little bits of plastic from the Rec afterwards!), I suggest that they bring a bucket with them ready-filled. Years of experience tell us that the taps in school just aren't up to the job of filling them, especially if there are lots of children wishing to fill at the same time. Super soakers are the best thing to use. Children will need to bring a complete change of clothes for afterwards. It is best if they wear swimming shorts/costumes under t-shirts and shorts; they will be able to change into these before the event. Please make sure they bring a towel! As they can't all get into the toilets to change at once due to our indoor distancing rules, if you would like to take your child home to dry off, that is fine. The water fight will be at 2.30pm – 2.50pm. Spectators are welcome...

Rounders.

Everyone will need to wash their hands after lunch and before the match. There will be a bucket of soapy water and hand sanitiser by the batting team to be used before picking up a bat and when returning to the team. Hands will be washed again in between innings and at the end of the match.
