Dear Parents and Carers.

New Learning Journeys have got underway and once again there is an air of excitement around the school with the children keen to tell us about their learning. #### **Tutors**

If you are thinking about hiring a tutor for your child, there are a few points of advice offered by the Local Authority:

- Hire a tutor who has an up-to-date DBS;
- Ask the tutor for details of two referees and follow them up with a phone call;
- Ask the tutor for the details of the parents of current or former pupils and follow them up with a phone call;
- Check that the tutor is properly accredited and qualified by asking to see evidence such as certificates and then contact the relevant accreditation body or organisation;
- Ask the tutor proactive questions; listen for inconsistencies in information you are being told and observe body language;
- Be clear where the tutoring will take place and who will be present. You may wish either to be in the same room, or to leave the door open and enter the room at random. Your child's bedroom is not a suitable study space;
- Trust your instincts, and don't be afraid of calling off the lessons if you or your child feels uncomfortable.

## **Lost Property**

There is, once again, a lot of lost property in school: 15 cardigans/jumpers, 2 pairs of trousers, 4 polo shirts, a winter coat, waterproof trousers....None of the items have names in them or the names have faded beyond legibility. It is the dream of all schools to have zero lost property with everything returned to its rightful owner straight away. Please help us realise that dream at Barcombe by naming **every piece** of clothing your child brings into school and checking regularly that the name can still be read.

## **Coats and Shoes**

Please ensure that your child has a warm, waterproof coat to wear when they are outside for playtimes and lunchtimes. Also, please ensure that their shoes are appropriate for winter conditions. We want our children dressed appropriately for the weather and the activities that they are doing.
