

ENGLISH Our English work will be based on our project work: Conflict. In Term 1 and 2, we will be studying texts and resources related to the project including: 'I Believe in Unicorns' by Michael Morpurgo and 'The Lion and the Unicorn' by Shirley Hughes. Our writing will not just be based on texts, but will explore the project in different ways. For this, there will be an historical focus until Christmas, really developing the children's non-fiction reading and writing skills. We will read a wide range of texts – fiction and non-fiction – to practise reading for different purposes and to identify themes and conventions within these texts and to extend vocabulary. We will also focus on learning different spelling rules each week and try to apply them in our writing.		MATHEMATICS In Maths, we will be developing a solid understanding of number and place value with a particular focus on rounding, partitioning and comparing a range of numbers. In year 4, we will be comparing numbers up to 10,000, rounding to 1000 and learning about negative numbers. Moving on to addition and subtraction, we will be adding and subtracting 4- digit numbers. In Year 5, we will compare numbers to 100,000 and round numbers within 100,000. We will also be learning about Roman numerals and solving multi step problems using written methods of addition and subtraction.	
PROJECT – Discover (History) Our focus for Terms 1 and 2 is History. In term 1, we will learn about the period leading up to and after World War 2 and develop our historian skills by closely examining primary and secondary resources. These skills will support children today in understanding the origins of information and will help them to determine how reliable a source is. After that, we will turn our attention to World War 1, Remembrance and then discuss other significant wars.		P.E. This term, Foxes will begin by developing their team-building skills through a range of multi skills lessons. As always, we will focus on improving our throwing, catching, running and jumping techniques.
