

FNGLISH

In our English lessons this term, Owls will be delving deep into our new Create Project of Still Life. In the first few weeks of Term 5, our English work will be based on a book, The Day the Crayons Quit, through which we will be further developing our persuasive writing, and formal letter writing skills.

Throughout this term, we will consider the following question: Are the Arts a true reflection of life? In our Whole-Class Reading sessions, we will be studying a range of fiction and non-fiction texts and will also read a class book each day. Through these texts, we will be developing our skills in these 6 areas in particular: Vocabulary, Inferring, Predicting, Explaining, Retrieval and Summarising.

MATHEMATICS

Owls will focus on a variety of new concepts this term, whilst also revising those introduced in previous years. We will be focussing on statistics – graphs, charts and tables as well as algebra and will be revising all sorts of maths in the first part of term 5

- Read and interpret bus and train timetables
- Read and interpret line graphs, bar graphs and pie charts
- Solve problems relating to data shown in different ways
- Solve problems with unknown amounts (algebra)

We will continue to practise our times tables using Times Table Rock Stars.

PROJECT – Create – Arts (art, music, dance, drama)

'Are the Arts a true reflection of life?' is our key question for this term. Our concepts are passion, dreams and pride. Through this project, we will be looking at how the Arts convey mood and how colour and music link. The children will be looking closely at art, trying out lots of different techniques, before creating a still life art work of their own passions and dreams for exhibition at the end of the year. They will be studying different genres of music and the moods they convey and then creating their own personal piece for performance.
