Coronavirus academic recovery support

Class teachers have assessed their pupils and have identified those who would benefit from small group interventions. The interventions started this week and the children joining the groups are working very hard. All parents have been contacted if their child is receiving this extra support.

Black History Month

October is Black History Month, and all our classes will be carrying out work to recognise the contributions people of African and Caribbean descent have made to our national and cultural life. For example, Hedgehogs will be studying Rosa Parks while Owls will be studying Jacques Francis and the abolition of slavery. 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Going forward, your child does not need a Covid test if they have a runny nose, are sneezing or feeling unwell but do not have a temperature, cough or loss of, or change in, sense of smell or taste because these are not normally symptoms of coronavirus.

Wrap Up Warm!

The weather is turning a little chillier now. So your child is warm at playtimes, and as we are endeavouring to keep a constant flow of fresh air in the classrooms, please make sure your child has a jumper in school and brings a warm coat to wear outdoors.

<u>Snacks</u>

Children may bring in <u>one</u> snack to eat at playtime or during the morning according to each class's routine. This should be no more than 100 calories. No nuts or seeds are to be brought into school at any time as we have children who are severely allergic. This includes peanut butter sandwiches which several children have recently brought in for lunch.

Google Classrooms and Tapestry

This week, you have received further information about our Google Classrooms plans for online learning for homework and should we be forced to close due to a national or localised lockdown. This includes your child's log-in credentials for the Google Classroom portal. Teachers have received further training on delivering learning through the Google Classrooms platform, and pupils have been practising accessing the site in class. Please log on when you can and familiarise yourself with Google Classroom.

Reception pupils in Hedgehogs Class will use their Tapestry log-in to access remote learning materials: Mrs Whittle is already communicating with families to get them fully set-up on the Tapestry system.

Help us keep in touch with you

Please ensure that our School Office has your up-todate contact details. We will need these if we ever need to contact you about your child feeling unwell during the school day. East Sussex County Council's 'Safeguarding Best Practice' requires schools to have at least **two** contact details for each family – so please make sure we have all the information we need.

Music and Art

We are really proud of the music and art at Barcombe. Our children have lots of wonderful opportunities and achieve highly.

At the moment, we are sadly restricted in our class and whole-school music-making as the scientific guidance does not allow us to sing or to play percussion instruments that have to be shared. Guidance is being updated all the time, and we are following it really carefully, so hopefully we will be singing again soon! We are, however, doing lots of other musical activities in class.

Our instrumental teachers are starting to teach again, either in person – you may have seen cellos being carried to school – or online. Mr Robinson, our violin teacher, has sent us a recruitment video which the children in Years 1 to 4 have watched in class this week. If you are interested in your child starting the violin, please see the email you were sent explaining how to sign up. Watch out for information about other instrumental opportunities for your child.

School is looking lovely with lots of beautiful artwork being produced. Teachers will be putting photos on the Google Classroom stream, so please keep checking back for updates.
