Welcome to Hedgehog Class **Curriculum** Information Terms 1 & 2

Mathematical Development

Our main focus for term 1 will be number and counting.

Reception will be learning to count up to 10 objects accurately, as well as developing their recognition of these numbers. Please help your child at home by spotting numbers and counting things everywhere you go! They will be learning to compare groups of objects and identifying which group has the most or least.

Year 1 will be ensuring our number knowledge is secure to 20, reading and writing and counting objects accurately. We will then progress to addition and subtraction. The year 1 children will use concrete apparatus to help them add and subtract 1 and 2 digit numbers.

We will then move onto 2D shapes, learning to sort them, name them and talk about how many sides and corners they have.

PSED

In PSED, we will be developing our circle time skills, and getting to know our new class friends. We will be talking about how we feel at different times at school and working together to write a set of 'Happy Hedgehog Rules'.

Art and DT

This term, we will be looking at a painting by Hokusai, called The Big Wave. We will use this to help us create our own sea pictures. We will be reading the story called The Naughty Bus and using junk modelling skills to make our own buses. **Reception Phonics** - We will be learning the individual letter sounds, using sounds, pictures and actions. I will be sending home 3 sounds each week for you to practise. Please help your child become familiar with recognising the lowercase letter shapes, and try and find things that begin with the letter sound.

As we learn individual letter sounds, we will begin to blend sounds to read 2 and 3 letter words.



Year 1 Phonics - Phonic sessions will happen daily and children will be ensuring they have a secure knowledge of their Phase 3 digraphs. We will be playing games to help them read words and encouraging them to spell words phonetically. Year 1 will also be focusing on using the correct letter formations.

RE

During term 1, we will be looking at the beauty of the world and the treasures we find here. We will be reading and exploring the Christian creation story as part of this. As we approach December, we will look at the Nativity story.

Language and Literacy

This term, we will be reading Pirate stories and non-fiction books to help us gain knowledge and write our own facts.

When the Reception children begin school, we will be reading Owl Babies and learning to retell the story together using pictures and puppets. We will be delving into how the characters felt and things they say in the story.

We will move onto The Naughty Bus and Traction Man when learning about toys.

Reception children will be focusing on identifying initial sounds for words. As well as developing our small hand muscles to support our pencil control for writing.

Year 1 children will be focusing on writing sentences with increasing independence. Next term, we will be reading Stone Soup and creating our own potions!

Physical Development

In PE this term, we will be focussing on developing movement and coordination. We will be exploring multi skills activities to develop balance, spatial awareness, agility and coordination.

Our Project is... Take One Treasure!

Our first topic is 'Take One Treasure' where we will begin by learning about pirates. We will be looking at historical sources to see what we can learn from them. In Science, we are going to be exploring floating and sinking using a variety of objects and materials, before making boats to test on the water. We will be making pirate maps using symbols to guide others to their treasure! We will move on to our own talk about our personal treasures such our families and toys. We will be comparing toys from the past to the toys we play with now, and learning about how things have changes over time.

Next term, we will be moving onto our treasured celebrations and traditions, which will include finding out about bonfire night, the story or Guy Fawkes and the Hindu celebration of Diwali. We will then move onto our exciting topic of Christmas!
