

ENGLISH

In term 5 and 6, we will be studying a mixture of fiction and non – fiction texts that are linked to our project work 'Landscapes'. We shall start with 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan and use this as the inspiration for a narrative piece of writing. Furthermore, we will read biographies about the artists and musicians we are studying. We will then research an artist and write a biography based on that person's life. During our whole class reading, we will read a wide range of texts, including 'The Lady of Shalott' by Alfred, Lord Tennyson. As part of the whole class reading session, we will practise reading for different purposes and identify themes and conventions within texts and will also be used to extend vocabulary. We will practise spelling in class and focus on different spelling rules and phonemes each week. Children's understanding of grammar, punctuation and vocabulary will be developed throughout the year during all topics and handwriting will be practised

PROJECT: THE ARTS

During this term's Arts project, we will focus mainly on visual art and music and endeavour to answer the question, 'What is the purpose of art?' We will be studying the works of a variety of landscape artists learn how they used the elements of art (line, space, value, form, colour, shape and texture). We will then experiment with these techniques to create our own pieces of art and work towards a final exhibition to display our works.

In Music, we will be listening to a wide variety of music and studying the musical elements - pitch, duration, dynamics, tempo, timbre, texture and silence. We will be considering how these elements can be organised within a musical structure and used to communicate different moods and effects. We will be exploring and explaining our own ideas and feelings about music and creating our own compositions using the elements of music.

Our topic this term is 'The Kingdom of God' and we will unpick the question 'When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?' The Christian holy day of Pentecost, is celebrated fifty days after Easter Sunday and commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feasts of Weeks, as described in the Acts of the Apostles.
