When you are out walking, keep an eye on the different plants that are growing around us at this time of year.



Mathematical Development

Our maths will be much linked to our topic with activities like sharing the sticks out for the Three Pigs and making button patterns on the Gingerbread People: doubling and subtracting them.

We need to use the language of 2D and 3D shape when building houses for the pigs.

We can make Gingerbread people and compare them by height.

We will also be consolidating our skills in adding and subtracting, especially one more/less and using the number line.

I will send some useful websites and games to support your home learning.

Physical Development

As well as using Jump Start Johnny, Joe Wicks, and Cosmic kids yoga for home PE, I will be sending a weekly PE activity to try at home. Some will be linked to sports day style races.

This term's challenge is to see if you can learn to undo and do up buttons!

Don't forget to have a go at making your own playdough and go to the dough disco on Youtube! **Phonics** -We will be consolidating our knowledge of digraphs and trigraphs this term. Then we will move onto Phase 4 initial and final consonant clusters. These include; br, bl, cr, cl, nt, nd, lt. When writing we need to listen really carefully for these sounds.

We will focus on applying the phonics knowledge we have learned to read and write labels, captions and sentences as often as possible to develop writing confidence.

I will share phonics sessions on Tapestry to work through at home.

Cooking time!

I will be suggesting some

home cooking activities to

try at home. These use lots

of skills, physical, reading,

language and math's.

Reading - Please continue to help your child to recognise high frequency and tricky words such as to, go, no, the, you, was by sight. This will develop your child's fluency when reading. Tuesday and Friday phonics sessions will focus on these words.

ICT

Linked with our topic the children can use tablet, I pad or phone to record their learning. Of course the children are developing their IT skills daily at the moment, so please share these via Tapestry. I will also share some Mini Mash activities for children to try.

Creative Development

We will learn about mixing 2 colours to make different colours, as well as developing the idea of making colours lighter and darker. The children will be building houses for the pigs from a range of materials including tyres, boxes, twigs and any other materials you can collect! We need to trap the pesky Gingerbread man so will work on trap designs.

Music

Language and Literacy

Our texts this term in our exciting journey into Traditional Tales: The Three Pigs, The Gingerbread Man, Wolf Week (non-fiction). Just for fun we have a bonus week at the end of term on Supertato for all those mini super heroes! We will be writing a speech bubble from the pigs, a mini letter from the pigs in reply to the wolf, simple instructions for decorating gingerbread people and writing clues for where he has hidden plus a wolf fact file!

We want to extend our <u>independent writing</u> skills this term, so please encourage your child to help write lists and short sentences at home.

Home writing → When supporting your child with writing at home, please remember to have the letter mat to hand and your tricky word mat too.

- → Please encourage your child to sound out the sounds in each word they want to write, using their phonics.
- → Encourage correct pencil grip when writing.

Understanding the World

I will be sharing some fun experiments that you can try at home, linked to our traditional tales. Making predictions, testing and discussing what we found out. We will be testing Mr Wolf's puff with a hairdryer experiment!

We will also be thinking about taking care of our environment, and ways we can help improve it, such as less use of plastic and recycling.
