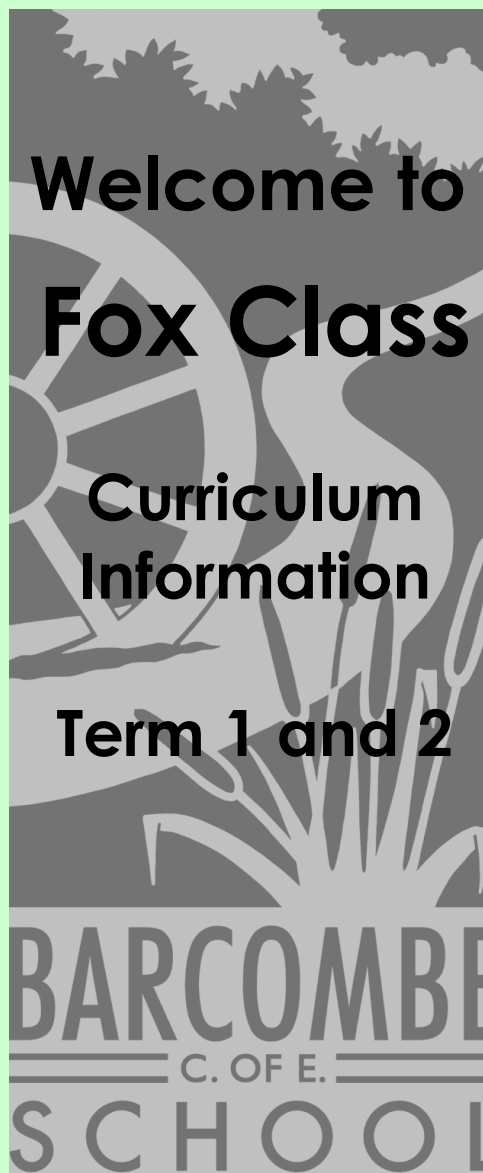

ENGLISH

In term 1 and 2 respectively, we will read *The Iron Man* by Ted Hughes and *Stig of the Dump* by Clive King. Our writing focus will include newspaper reports, as well as diary entries, persuasive writing and poetry. We will read a wide range of texts - fiction and non-fiction - to practice reading for different purposes and to identify themes and conventions within these texts. These texts will form the basis and inspiration for our writing and used to extend vocabulary. We will also focus on specific grammar and punctuation, such as direct and indirect speech, fronted adverbials and paragraphing. We will practice spelling in class and focus on different spelling rules each week. Children's understanding of grammar, punctuation and vocabulary will be developed throughout the year during all topics and handwriting will be practised frequently.

MATHEMATICS

In Maths we will be developing a solid understanding of number and place value and exploring various techniques to add, subtract, multiply and divide, both mentally and using a formal written method. We will be investigating negative numbers, rounding, ordering and comparing numbers, estimating and applying this knowledge to real life situations. The children will also be developing their ability to reason with and solve problems involving number and place value. In Year 4 the emphasis will be on the place value of numbers beyond 1,000, whereas in Year 5 it will be numbers up to 1,000,000. In Fox Class, we will continue to practice our times tables using Times Table Rock Stars.

HISTORY

In history this term, we will learn about medical pioneers, such as Edward Jenner and Marie Curie, and the breakthroughs that have impacted on our lives. In term 2, we will explore changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age and the development of mankind from hunter-gatherer to early farmer.

P.E.

In P.E. we will be looking at the skills involved in competitive games with the emphasis on communicating, collaborating and competing with each other. The children will develop their ability to use a variety of passes, using throwing techniques as well as with equipment. They will also be learning attacking and defending skills and putting them into use in competitive games. In term 2, the children will focus on movement and co-ordination, and further development of flexibility, strength, technique and control.

R.E.

In RE, we will be learning about The Gospels and identifying the features of Gospel texts, for example parable and narrative. In term 2, we will explore the Kingdom of God and how it relates to Christian teachings. We will also have a Christmas focus.

ART & DT

This term, the children will investigate the work of Roy Lichtenstein and use his work to inspire our own art. In term 2, we will study cave art using charcoal and pastels. We will look at different blending techniques and the use colour.

SCIENCE

This term we will be investigating animals, including humans, and what they need to survive. We will develop our knowledge of teeth and food chains, including producers, predators and prey. Next term, the topic will be 'Rocks and Soils' where we will discover how rocks are formed and how to identify and classify a variety of stones and soils. We will also look at how to identify fossils.

P.S.H.E

In P.S.H.E the topics are 'Being me in the world' and 'Celebrating differences'. The children will be using group discussions, games and role-play techniques to develop their awareness of themselves, others and the world around them.

FRENCH

Our theme in French will be 'All Around Town'. We will learn to develop our intercultural understanding by being introduced to the sights of some typical French cities. We will also learn to describe places in a town, count to 100 and give our address in French.

COMPUTING

Our first Computing unit is about e-safety. We will be learning how to stay safe online by finding out more about privacy settings, online conversations, connecting with others and digital literacy.

MUSIC

This term, our music work will focus on pulse. We will identify it in music and use it to create our own compositions. In term 2, we will focus on singing techniques, singing a range of songs.
