

ENGLISH

We will be studying an Indian folklore called 'Tiger Child'. We will use the book to inspire our own descriptive writing, as well as use this as a stimulus for information writing. Our second text links to our science focus on seasons and is called 'The Robot and the Bluebird.' In term 4, our text genre will be traditional tales and our writing focus will be recounting an event or experience.

Phonics sessions will continue daily across Key Stage 1 and children will be encouraged to spell words phonetically or use known spelling patterns during independent writing.

HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

During our India topic, the children will be locating India on a map or globe and learning about its culture. We will compare India with the UK, considering a variety of human and physical factors.

During term 4, we will be going back in time to look at Castles. We will consider how they were built, who lived in them and why they were attacked.

P.H.S.E

We will spend term 3 thinking about 'Dreams and Goals' - how to set goals, tackle new challenges and work effectively with partners. In term 4 we will be learning about staying healthy and good hygiene.

P.E.

During P.E we will be focussing on two topics: ball games and yoga. For ball games, children will learn some basic body positioning and throwing movements to increase their control and accuracy. Yoga relates to our topic and children will learn a variety of poses that will lead up to creating their own movement patterns.

MATHS

We will continue to solidify our knowledge with numbers to 100, skip count by 2s, 5s, and 10s, and use addition and subtraction within 20. As with all of our number work, we will be using concrete, pictorial and written methods to strengthen understanding of the key concepts, and solving a variety of fluency and reasoning problems to aid understanding. We will also be expanding our knowledge of shapes, and learning new skills to measure in various ways.

ICT

Children will be exploring and gaining some proficiency in Word Processing to develop their computer skills.

OUTDOOR LEARNING

We will be getting outside as much as possible this year to do lots of our learning at Wild about Barcombe. We will get muddy and dirty, but we will have great fun!

R.E.

This term, we are focusing on the story of Creation. The children will consider the Christian belief of who created the world. We will use stories, props, and storyboards in our learning. Next term, we will be examining the customs and beliefs associated with Easter.

SCIENCE

Our Science links with our topics. In term 3, the children will be studying seasons and comparing seasonal changes in UK and India. In term 4, we will be exploring everyday materials and examining the materials used to build castles.

Art and DT

Art will continue to be taught by Mrs Edwards - much to the children's delight! They will be exposed to various elements of Indian art and will focus on printmaking to create a piece of work. In term 4, textiles will be the focus and will have strong links to the Castle topic.
